**REGULATION OF THE GOVERNOR OF BANTEN  
NUMBER 16 OF 2020**

**REGARDING**

**GUIDELINES FOR LARGE-SCALE SOCIAL RESTRICTIONS FOR THE PURPOSE OF  
MITIGATING OF THE CORONA VIRUS DISEASE 2019 IN TANGERANG REGENCY,  
TANGERANG CITY, AND SOUTH TANGERANG CITY**

**WITH THE GRACE OF GOD ALMIGHTY**

**GOVERNOR OF BANTEN,**

- Considering : a. whereas based on the Decree of the Minister of Health of the Republic of Indonesia Number HK.01.07/MENKES/249/2020, a Large-Scale Social Restriction has been implemented in the region of Tangerang Regency, Tangerang City, and South Tangerang City Banten Province to accelerate mitigation of the Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19);
- b. whereas based on the considerations as referred to in letter a, it is necessary to stipulate a Governor Regulation regarding the Guidelines for Large-Scale Social Restrictions for the Purpose of Mitigating of the Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) in Tangerang Regency, Tangerang City, and South Tangerang City;
- Bearing in Mind : 1. Article 18 paragraph (6) of the 1945 Indonesian Constitution;

HAS DECIDED:

To Stipulate : GOVERNOR REGULATION REGARDING THE GUIDELINES FOR LARGE-SCALE SOCIAL RESTRICTIONS FOR THE PURPOSE OF MITIGATING THE CORONA VIRUS DISEASE 2019 IN TANGERANG REGENCY, TANGERANG CITY, AND SOUTH TANGERANG CITY.

CHAPTER I  
GENERAL PROVISIONS

Article 1

In this Governor Regulation, what is meant by:

1. Region is the Banten Province.
2. Governor is the Governor of Banten.
3. Regency/Mayor is the Regency of Tangerang, Mayor of Tangerang, and Mayor of South Tangerang.
4. Provincial Government is the Government of Banten Province.
5. Regency/City Government is the Government of the Tangerang Regency, Tangerang City, and South Tangerang City.
6. Large-Scale Social Restrictions (*Pembatasan Sosial Berskala Besar*) hereinafter abbreviated as PSBB are restrictions on certain activities of residents in an area suspected of being infected with the Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) in such a way as to prevent the possible spread of the Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19).
7. Necessity Goods are goods that affect the lives of many people with a high scale of needs fulfillment and is a supporting factor to the community's welfare.
8. Important Goods are strategic goods that have an important role in determining the continuity of national development.
9. Resident is every person who is domiciled and/or conducts activities in the Tangerang Regency, Tangerang City, and South Tangerang City.
10. Vulnerable Resident is the person domiciled in the Tangerang Regency, Tangerang City, and South Tangerang City which is evidenced from the Identity Card or statement letter from the official/authorized party in various extent does not have or less than the opportunity to develop his/her potentials as a result of the physical/non-physical conditions.

11. Business Actor is every individual Indonesian citizen or business entity in the form of a legal entity or non-legal entity that is established and domiciled in the jurisdiction of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia conducting business activities in the field of Trade.
12. Regional Apparatus is the supporting element of the Governor and the Regional House of Representatives in the establishment of governmental affairs which are the authority of the autonomous Region.
13. Task Force for the Acceleration of the Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) Mitigation of Banten Province, hereinafter referred to as the Provincial level COVID-19 Task Force, is the Task Force for the Acceleration of the Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) Mitigation formed by the Government of Banten Province for the Provincial level.
14. Task Force for the Acceleration of the Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) Mitigation in the Regency/City level, hereinafter referred to as the Regency/City level COVID-19 Task Force, is the Task Force for the Acceleration of the Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) Mitigation formed by the Government of City/Regency for the City/Regency level.
15. Evaluation Point, hereinafter referred to as Check Point is the place of evaluation to implement PSBB in a regency/city.

#### Article 2

This Governor Regulation is intended as a guideline for the implementation of PSBB in order to accelerate the mitigation of the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) in the Region.

#### Article 3

This Governor Regulation aims to:

- a. restrict certain activities and movements of people and/or goods in suppressing the spread of the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19);
- b. increase the anticipation of the escalation development of the spread of the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19);

- c. strengthen health management efforts due to the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19); and
- d. address the social and economic impact from the spread of the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19).

## CHAPTER II SCOPE

### Article 4

The scope of this Governor Regulation includes:

- a. the implementation of PSBB;
- b. rights, obligations as well as fulfillment of basic needs of the residents during PSBB;
- c. resources for the mitigation of the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19);
- d. monitoring, evaluation, and reporting; and
- e. sanctions.

## CHAPTER III IMPLEMENTATION OF PSBB

### Section One

#### General

### Article 5

- (1) In an effort to prevent the widespread of the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19), the Governor shall impose PSBB in the Tangerang Regency, Tangerang City, and South Tangerang City.

- (2) PSBB as referred to in paragraph (1) shall be conducted in the form of restrictions on outdoor activities carried out by every person who is domiciled and/or conducts activities in the Tangerang Regency, Tangerang City, and South Tangerang City.
- (3) During the implementation of PSBB, every person must:
  - a. implement Clean and Healthy Behavior (*Perilaku Hidup Bersih dan Sehat* or PHBS); and
  - b. wear a mask outside the house.
- (4) Restriction of activities outside the house in implementing the PSBB as referred to in paragraph (2) includes:
  - a. implementation of learning in Schools and/or other educational institutions;
  - b. work activities in the workplace;
  - c. religious activities in houses of worship;
  - d. activities in public places or facilities;
  - e. social and cultural activities; and
  - f. movement of people and goods using modes of transportation.
- (5) Coordination, mobilization of resources and operational implementation of PSBB as referred to in paragraph (1) shall be regulated by the Regent/Mayor.
- (6) The period of the implementation of the PSBB as referred to in paragraph (1) shall be stipulated by a Governor Decree.

## Section Two

### Restriction on the Implementation of Learning in Schools and/or Educational Institutions

#### Article 6

- (1) During the implementation of PSBB, a temporary suspension of activities in schools and/or other educational institutions shall be carried out.
- (2) In the implementation of the temporary suspension of activities in schools as referred to in paragraph (1), the implementation of all learning activities shall be changed by implementing learning at their respective homes/residences through long distance learning methods.
- (3) Events and activities of school administration services shall be carried out from home with an adjusted form of service.
- (4) The technicalities of implementation and evaluation of learning and school administration services which are the authority of the Provincial Region during the implementation of PSBB shall be further regulated by the Provincial Regional Apparatus that is responsible in the field of education.
- (5) The technicalities of implementation and evaluation of learning and school administration service outside the authority of the Provincial Region during the implementation of PSBB shall be further regulated by the Regency/Mayor and other agencies.

#### Article 7

- (1) Other educational institutions that are temporarily suspended during the implementation PSBB as referred to in Article 6 paragraph (1), includes:
  - a. higher education institutions;
  - b. training institutions;
  - c. research institutions,
  - d. development institutions; and
  - e. similar institutions.
- (2) Temporary suspension of activities in other educational institutions as referred to in paragraph (1), shall be excluded for higher education, research, and training institutions related to health services.



- (3) In the implementation of the temporary suspension of activities in other educational institutions as referred to in paragraph (1), events, learning activities, and administrative services shall be carried out online from home in accordance with the technical provisions from the relevant agencies.

#### Article 8

- (1) In the temporary suspension of activities during the implementation of PSBB, the person in charge of the school and other educational institutions must:
- a. ensure the learning process continues and the rights of students to receive an education are fulfilled;
  - b. conduct the prevention of the spread of the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) in the location and environment of schools and/or other educational institutions; and
  - c. maintain the security of schools and/or other educational institutions.
- (2) Prevention efforts to prevent the spread of the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) in the location and environment of schools and/or other educational institutions as referred to in paragraph (1) letter b shall be carried out periodically by means of:
- a. cleaning and disinfecting school facilities and infrastructure; and
  - b. implementing a prevention of the spread of the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) protocol for educators and other education personnel.

#### Section Three

##### Restriction of Work Activities in the Workplace

#### Article 9

- (1) During the implementation of PSBB, companies and/or factories may still carry out operational activities/events as long as health protocols are conducted.

- (2) In the event of workers/employees of companies and/or factories as referred to in paragraph (1) are found positively exposed with of the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19), then the activities of the company shall be temporarily suspended.
- (3) During the temporary suspension of work activities in the company and/or factory as referred to in paragraph (2), in particular the administration employees/workers and/or management shall replace the work activities in the workplace with the work activities at home/residence.
- (4) Companies and/or factories as referred in paragraph (1) may conduct the prevention of the spread of the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) by conducting an independent rapid test of the workers/employees.

#### Article 10

- (1) During the implementation of PSBB, a temporary suspension of work activities in the workplace/office shall be carried out.
- (2) During the temporary suspension of work activities in the workplace/office as referred to in paragraph (1), it is mandatory to replace work activities in the workplace with work activities at home/residence.
- (3) The head of the workplace/office as referred to in paragraph (2) who carries out temporary suspension of work activities in the workplace as referred to in paragraph (2) must:
  - a. maintain that the services provided and/or business activities are on a limited basis;
  - b. maintain the productivity/performance of the employees;
  - c. manage the office hours;
  - d. conduct prevention of the spread of the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) in the workplace location and environment;
  - e. maintain the security of the location and the environment around the workplace; and

- f. provide protection to workers exposed to the Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) in accordance with the laws and regulations.
- (4) Prevention efforts of the spread of the Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) in the workplace location and environment as referred to in paragraph (3) letter d, shall be carried out periodically by means of:
- a. cleaning the workplace environment;
  - b. disinfecting floors, walls and building equipment of the workplace;
  - c. closing entry access for unauthorized parties.
  - d. ability to conduct rapid test independently.

#### Article 11

- (1) Excluded from temporary suspension of work activities in the workplace/office as referred to in Article 10 paragraph (1), are for workplaces/offices with the following categories:
- a. all government agencies, both national or regional, based on the arrangements from the relevant government instances;
  - b. State/Regional-Owned Enterprises that participate in the mitigation of the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) and/or in meeting the basic needs of the community following the arrangements from the relevant ministries and/or the Regional Government;
  - c. business actors engaged in the following sectors:
    - 1. health;
    - 2. foodstuff/food/beverage;
    - 3. energy;
    - 4. communication and information technology;
    - 5. finance;
    - 6. logistics;
    - 7. hospitality;
    - 8. construction;

9. strategic industries;
  10. basic services, public utilities and industry stipulated as national vital objects and certain objects; and/or
  11. daily needs.
- d. local and international community organizations engaged in the disaster and/or social sector.
- (2) In the case of undertaking exceptions to the temporary suspension of work activities in the workplace/office as referred to in paragraph (1), the head of the workplace must conduct:
- a. restrictions of interactions in work activities;
  - b. restrictions of every person who has comorbidities and/or conditions that can be fatal if exposed to the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) to carry out activities in the workplace, among others:
    1. sufferers of high blood pressure;
    2. people with heart disease;
    3. diabetics;
    4. sufferers of lung disease;
    5. cancer sufferers;
    6. pregnant and nursing women; and
    7. more than 60 (sixty) years old.
  - c. implementation of the prevention of the spread of the Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) protocol at work, including:
    1. ensuring that the workplace is always clean and hygienic;
    2. having operational cooperation in health protection and prevention of the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) with the nearest health care facility for emergency measures;
    3. providing vitamins and additional nutrients to improve employees' immunity;
    4. conducting periodical disinfecting of the floor, walls and building equipment of the workplace;
    5. conduct detecting and monitoring of body temperature of employees entering the workplace and ensuring that no employees

- working in the workplace have an above normal body temperature or is sick;
6. requiring washing hands with soap and/or hand sanitizer including adequate and easy-to-access hand washing facilities with running water in the workplace;
  7. keeping the distance between employees (physical distancing) at least in the range of 1 (one) meter;
  8. information as well as advice/prevention calls for the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) to be disseminated at strategic locations in the workplace; and
  9. in the event that an employee in the workplace is found to be a patient under surveillance, then:
    - a) work activities in the workplace must be temporarily suspended for at least 14 (fourteen) working days;
    - b) medical staff assisted by a security unit shall evacuate and spray disinfectants on all workplace, working facilities and equipment; and
    - c) temporary suspension shall be implemented until the process of evacuating and spraying disinfectants, as well as conducting health examination and isolation of employees who have made physical contact with employees exposed to the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) have been completed.
- (3) With respect to the provision of food and beverages, the person in charge of a restaurant/dining place/similar business has the obligation to:
- a. restrict the services to take-away directly, through online ordering, and/or by telephone/delivery service;
  - b. keep the standing or sitting queue at least 1 (one) meter between customers;
  - c. apply the principle of food sanitation hygiene in the process of handling food in accordance with provisions;
  - d. provide the supporting devices such as gloves and/or food tongs to minimize direct contact with ready meals in the preparation, processing and serving process;

- e. ensure the adequacy of the heating process in food processing according to standards;
  - f. conduct cleaning of work areas, facilities and equipment, especially those that have a surface that is in direct contact with food;
  - g. provide handwashing facilities with running water and soap for customers and employees;
  - h. prohibit employees who are sick or showing an above normal body temperature, cough, runny nose, diarrhea and shortness of breath to work; and
  - i. require food servers to use gloves, head masks and work attire in accordance with occupational safety and health guidelines.
- (4) With respect to hotel activities, the person in charge of the hotel must:
- a. provide special services for guests who want to do independent isolation;
  - b. restrict guests to only activities in hotel rooms by utilizing room service;
  - c. eliminate activities and/or close hotel service facilities that can create crowds in the hotel area;
  - d. prohibit guests who are sick or showing an above normal body temperature, cough, runny nose, diarrhea, and shortness of breath to enter the hotel; and
  - e. require employees to wear masks, gloves, and work attire in accordance with occupational safety and health guidelines.
- (5) With respect to construction activities, the head of the workplace has the obligations with the following provisions:
- a. on-going construction activities may be carried out by restricting workers' activities to only the project area; and
  - b. the owner and/or service provider of construction works must:

1. appoint a person in charge in the implementation of the Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) prevention in the project area;
  2. restrict workers' activities and interactions to be carried out only within the project area;
  3. provide shelter and daily necessities for all workers while in the project area;
  4. provide health space in the workplace equipped with adequate health facilities;
  5. require workers to wear masks, gloves, and work attire in accordance with occupational safety and health guidelines;
  6. require hand washing with soap and/or hand sanitizer and provide hand washing facilities with running water that is adequate and easy-to-access in the workplace; and
  7. prohibit anyone, both workers and guests, who have an above normal body temperature from being inside the work site;
  8. deliver explanations, suggestions, campaigns, promotion of technical prevention of the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) in every morning Occupational Safety and Health (*Kesehatan dan Keselamatan Kerja*, K3) counseling or safety morning talk; and
  9. conduct periodic monitoring of the health of workers while in the project area.
- (6) The Regent/Mayor may add workplace/office exempted from the temporary suspension of work activities as referred to in paragraph (1) and stipulate the technical arrangements in accordance with the laws and regulations.

#### Section Four

##### Restrictions on Religious Activities in Houses of Worship

##### Article 12

- (1) During the implementation of PSBB, temporary closure of religious activities in houses of worship and/or in certain places shall be carried out.
- (2) During the temporary suspension of religious activities in houses of worship and/or in certain places as referred to in paragraph (1), religious activities shall be carried out in their respective homes with the core family.

- (3) During the temporary suspension of religious activities in houses of worship and/or in certain places as referred to in paragraph (1), activities to mark the time of worship such as calls to prayer (*adzan*), bells, and/or other time markers shall be carried out as usual.

#### Article 13

- (1) During the implementation of PSBB, the person in charge of houses of worship must:
- a. provide education or understanding to their respective worshipers to continue to carry out religious activities at home;
  - b. prevent the spread of the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) in their respective houses of worship in accordance with the terms of health protocol; and
  - c. maintain the security of the respective houses of worship.
- (2) Efforts to prevent the spread of the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) in the houses of worship as referred to in paragraph (1) letter b shall be carried out periodically by means of:
- a. cleaning houses of worship and the surrounding environment;
  - b. disinfecting floors, walls and building equipment of the houses of worship; and
  - c. closing entry access for unauthorized parties.

#### Section Five

##### Restrictions on Activities in Public Places or Facilities

#### Article 14

- (1) During the implementation of PSBB, residents are prohibited from conducting activities with more than 5 (five) persons in public places or facilities.



- (2) The organizers of public place or public facilities must temporarily close the public places or facilities for public activities during the implementation of PSBB.
- (3) The following activities are exempted from the prohibition to conduct activities in public place or facilities as referred to in paragraph (1):
  - a. fulfilling their basic needs and/or daily needs; and
  - b. conducting sports activities independently.
- (4) The Regent/Mayor may stipulate additional categories to the categories of activities exempted from the prohibition on activities in public places or facilities as referred to in paragraph (3) in accordance with the provisions of laws and regulations.

#### Article 15

- (1) The fulfillment of basic needs as referred to in Article 14 paragraph (3) letter a, includes the provision, processing, distribution and/or delivery activities:
  - a. foodstuffs/food/beverages;
  - b. energy;
  - c. communication and information technology;
  - d. financial, banking and payment systems; and/or
  - e. logistics.
- (2) The fulfillment of daily needs as referred to in Article 14 paragraph (3) letter a, includes:
  - a. provision of retail goods at:
    - 1. community market;

2. self-service stores, in the form of minimarkets, supermarkets, hypermarkets, wholesale distributors and specialty stores both independent and located in shopping centers;
  3. grocery stores/shop;
  4. medicine stores/pharmacies; and
  5. depots of drinking water refill.
- b. laundry.
- (3) In providing services for the fulfillment of residents' needs during the implementation of PSBB as referred to in paragraphs (1) and (2), business actors and the consumers shall comply with the provisions on restriction of activities as follows:
- a. prioritizing online and/or remote ordering of goods with delivery services;
  - b. participate in maintaining economic stability and purchasing power of goods consumers by refraining from raising the price of goods;
  - c. conducting periodical disinfection in the place of business.
  - d. conducting detection and monitoring of body temperature of the employees and consumers entering the market/store and ensuring that employees on duty are not undergoing light fever or sickness;
  - e. requiring consumers to wear masks;
  - f. implementing physical distancing between consumers visiting the market/store of at least 1 meter;
  - g. requiring all employees to wear masks and work attire in accordance with work health and safety guidelines;
  - h. providing adequate and easy-to-access hand washing facilities using running water for consumers and employees; and
  - i. implementing the recommendation to wash hands with soap and/or hand sanitizer.

#### Article 16

- (1) Independently conducted sports activities as referred to in Article 14 paragraph (3) letter b, may be restrictively carried out by residents outside of their homes during the implementation of PSBB.
- (2) Independently conducted sports activities as referred to in paragraph (1) are carried out under the following conditions:
  - a. they are conducted independently and not conducted in groups; and
  - b. conducted restrictively near the residential area.

#### Section Six

##### Restrictions on Social and Cultural Activities

#### Article 17

- (1) During the implementation of PSBB, temporary suspension of social and cultural activities causing crowds of people is implemented.
- (2) Social and cultural activities as referred to in paragraph (1) also include activities relating to gatherings or meetings on:
  - a. politics;
  - b. sports;
  - c. entertainment;
  - d. academic; and
  - e. culture.

#### Article 18

- (1) The following activities are exempted from the suspension of social and cultural activities as referred to in Article 17 paragraph (1):
  - a. circumcision (*khitan*);
  - b. wedding; and
  - c. burial and/or religious procession (*takziah*) of persons passing away due to causes other than the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19).
  
- (2) *Khitan* as referred to in paragraph (1) point a is carried out under the following conditions:
  - a. conducted in medical services facilities;
  - b. attended by limited number of people;
  - c. wearing masks;
  - d. exclusion of ceremonies that gather crowds; and
  - e. physical distancing of at least 1 (one) meter between attendants must be maintained.
  
- (3) The marriage activities as referred to in paragraph (1) letter b, is carried out :
  - a. conducted at the Religious Affairs Office and/or Civil Registration Office.
  - b. attended by limited number of people;
  - c. exclusion of marriage receptions that gather crowds; and
  - d. physical distancing of at least 1 (one) meter between attendants must be maintained.
  
- (4) The burial and/or funeral of persons passing away due to causes other than the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) referred to in paragraph (1) letter c, is carried out under the following conditions:

- a. conducted in funeral homes;
  - b. attended by limited number of people;
  - c. wearing masks; and
  - d. physical distancing of at least 1 (one) meter between attendants must be maintained.
- (5) The Regent/Mayor may add categories of resident activities that are exempted from the prohibition on social and cultural activities as referred to in paragraph (1), in accordance with the provisions of laws and regulations.

## Section Seven

### Restrictions on the Use of Transportation Modes for the Movement of People and Goods

#### Article 19

- (1) During the implementation of PSBB, all movement of people and/or goods shall be temporarily suspended, except for the purpose of:
- a. fulfillment of basic needs; and
  - b. activities permitted during the implementation of PSBB.
- (2) Activities permitted during the implementation of PSBB as referred to in paragraph (1) letter b, consist of:
- a. transportation carrying passengers including air, sea, train, highway (public/private transportation) transportation services shall continue to operate with a restriction on the amount of passengers.
  - b. transportation carrying goods, including air, sea, train, highway transportation services shall continue to operate for important and essential goods, among others:
    1. hauling trucks for medical, health and sanitation needs;
    2. transportation of goods for basic needs;

3. transportation for food and beverages including goods such as vegetables and fruits that need to be distributed to markets and supermarkets;
  4. transportation for the circulation of money;
  5. transportation of oil fuel/gas fuel;
  6. hauling trucks for the distribution of raw materials for manufacturing and assembling industries;
  7. hauling trucks for export and import purposes;
  8. hauling trucks and buses for the distribution of shipment items (service couriers, express delivery, and the like);
  9. pickup bus transportation for manufacturing and assembling industry employees; and
  10. crossing ferry transportation.
- c. Transportation services for services of fire trucks, law and order services and emergency services shall continue to operate.
- d. Train, airports and ports, including airports and ports for the Indonesian National Army (TNI)/Indonesian National Police (POLRI), for the movement of cargo, aid and evacuation, and the relevant operational organization shall continue to operate.
- (3) Users of personal passenger cars are obliged to comply with the following provisions:
- a. such cars are only used to fulfill basic needs and/or other activities permitted during the implementation of PSBB;
  - b. conduct disinfection of the vehicle after being used;
  - c. wear a mask inside the vehicle;
  - d. limiting the number of persons at a maximum 50% (fifty percent) from the vehicle capacity; and
  - e. refrain from driving if the body temperature reaches above normal temperature or experiencing sickness.

- (4) Users of personal motorcycles are are obliged to comply with the following provisions:
  - a. such personal motorcycles are only used to fulfill basic needs and/or other activities permitted during the implementation of PSBB;
  - b. conduct disinfection of the vehicle after being used;
  - c. wear a mask inside the vehicle; and
  - d. refrain from driving if the body temperature reaches above normal temperature or experiencing sickness.
- (5) The application-based two wheel transportation services shall be restricted for transportation of goods only.
- (6) Passenger transportation with public motor transportation, train transportation, and/or goods transportation moods are obliged to comply with the following provisions:
  - a. limiting the number of persons at a maximum of 50% (fifty percent) of the vehicle's capacity;
  - b. specifically for public motorized vehicles with routes and rail transportation, operating hours are limited from 05.00 WIB until 19.00 WIB on time and with frequency as needed;
  - c. conduct periodical disinfection on the transportation modes used;
  - d. wearing masks;
  - e. detecting and observing the body temperature of officials and passengers entering the transportation facilities;
  - f. ensuring that no operators and passengers of the transportation mode have an above normal body temperature or is sick; and
  - g. maintaining physical distancing between passengers at least 1 (one) meter apart.

- (7) The limitation of the number of persons to a maximum of 50% (fifty percent) of the private passenger car's capacity as referred to paragraph (3) letter d and the limitation of the number of persons to a maximum of 50% (fifty percent) of the public motor transportation's capacity as referred to in paragraph (6) letter a are stated in the Appendix which is an integral part of this Governor Regulation.
- (8) The Regent/Mayor may add to the transportation modes exempted from the temporary suspension of transportation facilities for the transportation of persons and/or goods as referred to in paragraph (2), in accordance with the provisions of laws and regulations.

CHAPTER IV  
CERTAIN ACTIVITIES THAT ARE STILL CARRIED OUT DURING LARGE-SCALE  
SOCIAL RESTRICTIONS

Article 20

Certain activities that are continued to be carried out during PSBB covers:

- a. health services facilities;
- b. other activities related to defense and security aspects; and
- c. Central, Province and Regency/City task force activities

CHAPTER V  
RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS AS WELL AS THE FULFILLMENT OF THE BASIC  
NEEDS OF THE RESIDENTS DURING PSBB

Section One

Rights and Obligations

Article 21



- (1) During the implementation of PSBB, all Residents in the Tangerang Regency, Tangerang City, and South Tangerang City region have equal rights to:
  - a. receive treatment and services from the Provincial Regional Government and the Regency/City Regional Government;
  - b. receive primary health services according to their medical needs;
  - c. obtain public data and information in relation to the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19);
  - d. ease of access to public complaint services in relation to the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19); and
  - e. care services for the deceased and burial services for persons passing away due to and/or suspected of the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19).
- (2) The implementation of the fulfillment of rights as referred to in paragraph (1) must follow the technical guidelines determined by the Regent/Mayor.

#### Article 22

- (1) During the implementation of PSBB, all Residents of in the Tangerang Regency, Tangerang City, and South Tangerang City region shall:
  - a. comply with all provisions on the implementation of PSBB;
  - b. participate in the implementation of PSBB; and
  - c. implement the clean and healthy behavior (*Perilaku Hidup Bersih dan Sehat* or PHBS).
- (2) In the mitigation of the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19), every resident shall:
  - a. participate in the testing and sampling for the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) in the epidemiology examination (contact tracing) if the officer has instructed such examination;

- b. conduct self-isolation in the place of residence and/or shelter or in the hospital based on medical workers' recommendation; and
  - c. report to medical workers in the event of exposure to the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) of themselves and/or their family.
- (3) The implementation of the obligations as referred to in paragraph (2) must comply with the technical instructions stipulated by the Regent/Mayor.

## Section Two

### Fulfillment of the Basic Needs of the Residents During PSBB

#### Article 23

- (1) The Provincial Regional Government and the Regency/City Regional Government may provide social aid to Vulnerable Residents affected in fulfilling their basic needs during the implementation of PSBB.
- (2) The social aids as referred to in paragraph (1) are provided in the form of essential needs and/or other direct aid of which distribution mechanism shall be in accordance with the provisions of laws and regulations.
- (3) The amount of social aid as referred to in paragraph (1) is determined by the decree of the head region.
- (4) The stipulation of the eligible receiver of social aid as referred to in paragraph (2) shall be stipulated in accordance with the provisions of laws and regulations.

#### Article 24

- (1) The Provincial Regional Government and the Regency/City Regional Government may provide incentives to Business Actors affected by the implementation of PSBB.
- (2) The incentives as referred to in paragraph (1) are provided in the form of:
  - a. reduction of tax and regional retribution for business actors;

- b. provision of social aids to employees affected by the implementation of PSBB; and/or
  - c. other aids in accordance with the provisions of laws and regulations.
- (3) The implementation of the provision of incentives as referred to in paragraph (1) shall be carried out in accordance with the provisions of the laws and regulations, and taking into account the financial capacities of the Region.

## CHAPTER VI RESOURCES FOR THE MITIGATION OF THE CORONA VIRUS DISEASE (COVID-19)

### Article 25

- (1) In order to implement the handling and mitigation of the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) in Tangerang Regency, Tangerang City, and South Tangerang City, the Regency/City Government shall organize a database and information on the needs of provision and distribution of resources.
- (2) Procedures and the use of information system for the purpose of provision and distribution of resources as referred to in paragraph (1) is stipulated by the Regent/Mayor.

### Article 26

- (1) Regency/city governments may conduct institutional collaboration on the implementation of PSBB with other parties in accordance with the provisions of the laws and regulations.
- (2) Institutional collaboration as referred to in paragraph (1) shall be conducted in the form of:
- a. human resources support;
  - b. facilities and infrastructure;
  - c. data and information;

- d. services and/or other support.

## CHAPTER VII MONITORING, EVALUATION, AND REPORTING

### Article 27

- (1) The monitoring and evaluation of the implementation of PSBB shall be conducted for the purpose of assessing the success of the implementation of PSBB in breaking the transmission chain of the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19).
- (2) The monitoring and evaluation as referred to in paragraph (1) shall be conducted by the regional level COVID-19 Task Force in accordance with their authorities and duties.
- (3) Assessment of PSBB success as referred to in paragraph (1) is based on the following criteria:
  - a. implementation of PSBB in accordance with this Governor Regulation and Regency/Mayor Regulations;
  - b. number of cases; and
  - c. the spread of cases.

### Article 28

- (1) During the implementation of PSBB, Provincial Governments, Regency/City Governments, private sector, academicians, the residents, and the media shall actively participate in monitoring of the implementation of PSBB.
- (2) The monitoring of the implementation of PSBB as referred to in paragraph (1) shall be reported public complaint services channel owned by the Provincial Government and/or Regency/City Government.
- (3) The result of public reports as referred to in paragraph (2) shall be followed up by the regional level Task Force to COVID-19 in accordance with their authorities and duties.

#### Article 29

- (1) To ensure the implementation of PSBB in Regencies/Cities, Check Points shall be required.
- (2) Check Points as referred to in paragraph (1) shall be determined by the Regent/Mayor.

#### Article 30

- (1) The monitoring at Check Points as referred to in Article 29 (1) shall be carried out by:
  - a. Regency/city Transportation Service Office; and/or
  - b. Regency/City Pamong Praja Police Unit.
- (2) The monitoring at Check Points as referred to in paragraph (1) may be assisted by:
  - a. Banten Province Transportation Service Office
  - b. Banten Province Police Unit; and
  - c. Indonesian National Police.
- (3) The monitoring of Check Point as referred to in paragraph (1) and paragraph (2) shall be done for 24 (twenty four) hours.

### CHAPTER VIII SANCTIONS

#### Article 31

Violations of the provisions on the implementation of PSBB is subject to sanctions in accordance to the provisions of laws and regulations.

CHAPTER IX  
CLOSING PROVISIONS

Article 32

This Governor Regulation is effective on the date of enactment.

For public cognizance, order the enactment of this Governor Regulation by virtue of its inclusion in Regional Gazette of the Banten Province.

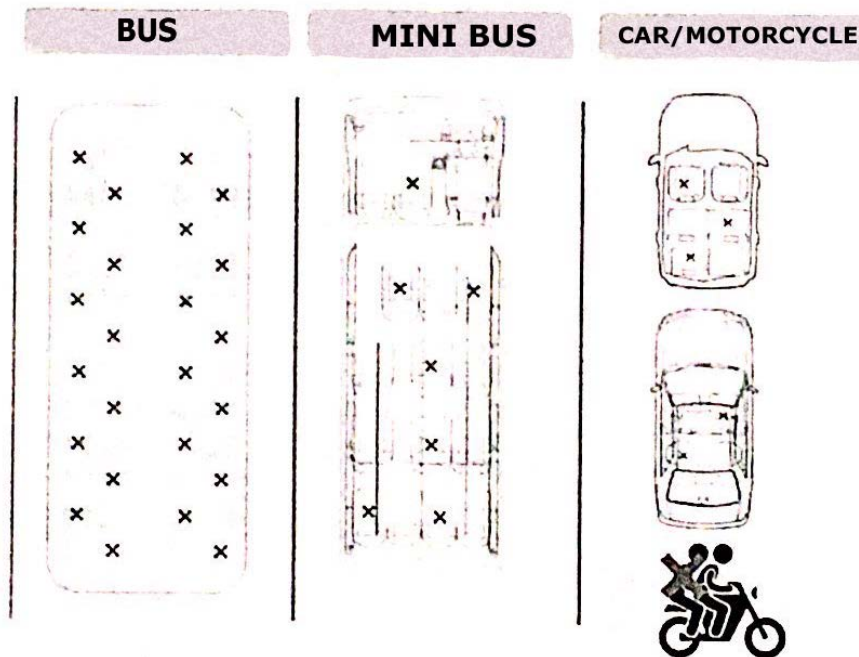
