CIRCULAR LETTER
NUMBER 08 OF 2021

REGARDING
THE EXTENSION OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF VILLAGE/SUB-DISTRICT BASED
RESTRICTIONS OF COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES IN THE NEW ERA OF LIFE ORDER IN
BALI PROVINCE

Pursuant to:

1. Instruction of the Minister of Home Affairs Number 14 of 2021 regarding the Extension of the Implementation of Micro-Based Restrictions of Community Activities and Optimizing Command Post for Handling Corona Virus Disease 2019 at Village and Sub-District Levels to Control the Spread of Corona Virus Disease 2019;
2. Regulation of the Governor of Bali Number 10 of 2021 regarding the Implementation of Discipline and Law Enforcement of Health Protocols as an Effort for the Prevention and Control of Corona Virus Disease 2019 in the New Era of Life Order; and

3. Circular Letter of the Governor of Bali Number 3355 of 2020 regarding Protocols for the New Era of Life Order.

In observance to:

1. The current high rate of Covid-19 transmission in the Bali Province area, which is marked by the increasing number of new Covid-19 cases per day; and
2. The increasing importance for all parties to maintain the health, comfort, security, and safety of the Balinese community.

Enacts provisions regarding the Extension of the Implementation of Village/Sub-District Based Restrictions of Community Activities in the New Era of Life Order in Bali Province, as follows:

1. The implementation of Village/Sub-District based Restrictions of Community Activities (*Pemberlakuan Pembatasan Kegiatan Masyarakat – “PPKM”*) in Regencies/Cities throughout Bali is stipulated based on the Covid-19 zoning map and criteria at the Village/Sub-District level stipulated by the Regents/Mayors throughout Bali by referring to the Instruction of the Minister of Home Affairs Number 14 of 2021.
2. The implementation of Village/Sub-District based PPKM in each sector, with the following provisions:
 - a. limiting office space/work by implementing Work from Office to a maximum of 50%, with the remaining working from home by implementing stricter health protocols;
 - b. prioritizing Work from Home for employees residing outside the Regency/City area where the office is located;
 - c. conducting full teaching and learning activities online and offline or face-to-face, for universities/academics to be opened in stages with pilot projects stipulated by the Regional Head Regulations (Perkada), or Circular Letters, with strict implementation of health protocols;
 - d. essential sectors, such as health, foodstuffs, food, beverages, finance, banking, which are related to the basic needs of the community, may still operate 100% with operating hours regulation, capacity regulation, and stricter implementation of health protocols;
 - e. activities in restaurants/dining places/food stalls and the like for dine-in services shall be carried out at a maximum of 50% of normal capacity until 22.00 Central Indonesian Time, while food services via delivery/takeaway are still permitted according to their respective operating hours by implementing stricter health protocols;

- f. activities in shopping centers/malls shall operate until no later than 22.00 Central Indonesian Time by implementing stricter health protocols;
 - g. activities in traditional markets shall be carried out by regulating the circulation of visitors by maintaining distance and implementing stricter health protocols;
 - h. activities in the construction sector are allowed to operate 100% by implementing stricter health protocols;
 - i. allow to be opened and implemented with a maximum capacity limitation of 50% (fifty percent) with the implementation of stricter health protocols in public facilities, traditional, religious, artistic and socio-cultural activities, with a very limited number of participants and a very limited duration which arrangements are stipulated under a Regional Head Regulations (Perkada) or Circular Letter, as well as requiring a rapid antigen test for the committee and participants present; and
 - j. activities in the local public transportation sector shall be carried out by regulating the capacity, operating hour, and implementing stricter health protocols.
3. Every Person, Business Actor, Manager, Organizer or Person in Charge of Public Places and Facilities carrying out activities is obliged to carry out the health protocols that have been provided, namely:
- a. implementing a healthy and Covid-19-free lifestyle with **6 M**: Wearing standard masks correctly (*Memakai masker standar dengan benar*), Washing hands (*Mencuci tangan*), Keeping distance (*Menjaga jarak*), Reducing travels (*Mengurangi bepergian*), Boosting immunity (*Meningkatkan imun*), and Obeying the rules (*Mentaati aturan*);
 - b. no crowding;
 - c. limiting activities in public/crowded places;
 - d. limiting the number of visitors to a maximum of 50% of the available capacity; and
 - e. complying with the business activities operating hour **in accordance with point (2) above**.
4. Every person should limit activities outside the house and try to delay/reduce travels outside the area, especially in the red zone category.
5. Domestic Travelers (PPDN) who **will enter the Bali area** must comply with the following provisions:
- a. be responsible for their health, and observe and comply with the applicable terms and conditions;
 - b. those who travel by **air transportation are required** to show a statement letter of **negative PCR-based swab test** result no later than 2 x 24 hours before departure. Meanwhile, for land and sea transportation, it is mandatory to show a statement letter of **negative PCR-based swab test** result or a

- negative Rapid Antigen Test** result no later than 2 x 24 hours before departure.
- c. To demonstrate the accuracy and ensure the authenticity of the **negative PCR-based swab** result or the **negative Rapid Antigen Test result**, the statement letter must be accompanied by a **Barcode/QRCode**.
 - d. for those who travel by **air transportation**, in addition to fulfilling the requirements as referred to in letter b, they are required to fill in the Indonesian *e-HAC*;
 - e. children under the age of 5 (five) are not required to show negative PCR-based swab test or Rapid Antigen Tests results; and
 - f. for PPDN **departing from Bali** using sea transportation, crossing transportation, land transportation, private passenger vehicles, and logistics vehicles may use a statement letter of negative PCR-based swab test or Antigen Rapid Tests result **that are still valid for the return trip to Bali**.
6. All parties are reminded to be more serious, orderly, disciplined, and fully responsible for complying with the following provisions:
- a. Governor of Bali Regulation Number 10 of 2021 regarding the Implementation of Discipline and Law Enforcement of Health Protocols as an Effort for the Prevention and Control of Corona Virus Disease 2019 in the New Era of Life Order; and
 - b. Circular Letter of the Governor of Bali Number 3355 of 2020 regarding Protocols for the Order of the New Era of Life.
7. Every person, Business Actor, Manager, Organizer or Person in Charge of public places and facilities who violate the provisions as referred to in number 6 **shall be subject to strict sanctions** in accordance with Regulation of the Governor of Bali Number 10 of 2021 and other laws and regulations.
8. Airport, Port, and Land Transportation Operators to regulate and tighten the implementation of procedures and inspection of PPDN travel requirements, including to regulate the availability of human resources and equipment, as well as providing daily reports to Bali Province COVID-19 Handling Task Force. Specifically for the Ketapang-Gilimanuk ferry port, strict supervision of test results for PPDN shall be carried out, by placing a joint inspection post coordinated by the Port Health Office (*Kantor Kesehatan Pelabuhan – KKP*), facilitated by PT. ASDP Indonesia Ferry.
9. To the Head of Villages/Head of Sub-District to synergize with the *Bandesa Adat*.
- a. to immediately establish a Customary Village-Based Covid-19 Handling Mutual Cooperation ("**Gotong Royong**") Task Force with the organizational structure, tasks, and functions shall be regulated in the Joint Decree of the Governor of Bali and the Bali Province Traditional Village Council regarding

- the Establishment of Customary Village-Based Covid-19 Handling *Gotong Royong* Task Force in Bali;
- b. before the Customary Village-Based Covid-19 Handling *Gotong Royong* Task Force is formed, the implementation of Village/Sub-District based PPKM shall be handled by Village/Sub-District Volunteers and the Customary Village-based Covid-19 Prevention *Gotong Royong* Task Force in Bali; and
 - c. to activate Customary Village-Based Covid-19 Prevention *Gotong Royong* Command Post in Bali as a forum for the activities of the *Gotong Royong* Task Force as referred to in letter a;
 - d. the implementation as referred to in letter c, specifically for Village-level Command Posts may stipulate or make amendments to regulations in the form of village regulations, head of village regulations and head of village decisions.
10. To the Regents/Mayors throughout Bali to form a District Covid-19 Handling *Gotong Royong* Command Post led by the Head of District for supervision and reporting of Village/Sub-District level Command Posts.
 11. To the Regents/Mayors throughout Bali to conduct incidental inspections of PPDN who use the Port and National Roads by activating inspection posts that synergize with Indonesian National Armed Forces/Police Force of the Republic of Indonesia officers at regional borders to ensure the implementation of health protocols and travel requirements for PPDN.
 12. To Regents/Mayors throughout Bali to increase the number and reach of tracing and testing, as well as treatment by increasing the capacity and quality of health services.
 13. To Regents/Mayors throughout Bali to **prepare more detailed and specific regulations regarding** the Extension of the Implementation of Village/Sub-District based Restrictions of Community Activities (PPKM) in their respective regions based on the Covid-19 zoning map at the Village/Sub-District level, as well as to coordinate, communicate, and socialize this Circular to be implemented in an orderly, disciplined, and responsible manner.
 14. The financing needs for the implementation of the Covid-19 Handling *Gotong Royong* Command Post at the Village/Sub-District level shall be charged to the budget of each element in accordance with the following basic needs:
 - a. needs at the Village level shall be charged to the Village Fund and can be supported from other sources of income of the Village through the Village Revenue and Expenditure Budget;
 - b. needs at the Sub-District level shall be charged to the Regency/City Regional Revenue and Expenditure Budget;
 - c. needs at the Customary Village level shall be charged to the Customary Village Revenue and Expenditure Budget;
 - d. needs related to the Village Advisory Officer (*Bintara Pembina Desa – Babinsa*) / Community Security and Order Supervisor Officer (*Bhayangkara*)

- Pembina Keamanan dan Ketertiban Masyarakat – Bhabinkamtibmas*) shall be charged to the Budget of the National Armed Forces/Police Force of the Republic of Indonesia; and
- e. needs related to the strengthening of testing, tracing, and treatment shall be charged to the Ministry of Health or Budget of the National Board for Disaster Management, the Bali Provincial/District/City Planned Universal Regional Budget.
15. The Commander of Regional Military Command IX/Udayana, the Head of the Bali Regional Police, the Head of the Bali Provincial Civil Service Police Unit and the Traditional Village *Pacalang* are requested to carry out **more intensive, massive, and assertive** disciplinary enforcement operations to ensure the effective implementation of this Circular.
16. This Circular shall come into force on Monday (*Soma Kliwon, Uye*), **June 28, 2021**, until further notice.
17. With the enactment of this Circular, the Circular Letter of the Governor of Bali Number 07 of 2021 regarding the Extension of the Implementation of Village/Sub-District based Restrictions of Community Activities in the New Era of Life Order in Bali Province is revoked and declared invalid.

Thus this Circular is delivered to be implemented with discipline and full responsibility. Thank you for your support and cooperation.
